



2026 Give Kids A Chance Scholarship | Application Guidelines

Deadline for application submission is Sunday, March 15th at 11:59 pm

Notification of Award: April 22nd

Annual Award Amount: \$1,250

Scholarship Criteria

Give Kids A Chance is offering scholarship grants in the amount of \$1,250 to high school seniors planning to attend college. The scholarship will be offered to those students graduating from public high schools in the State of Florida. Students who are attending college and who have previously received a scholarship award through the Give Kids A Chance scholarship program will also be eligible to apply for additional scholarship awards for each year they remain in college and maintain a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale (but for no more than 4 years). However, the fact that an applicant may previously have received a scholarship through this program is no assurance that additional scholarship grants will be awarded.

If awarded, funds can be used to cover eligible educational expenses up to the institution's cost of attendance, as determined by your college or university.

****These funds can only be used for undergraduate level studies**

Submission + Deadline

Applications must be submitted online by Sunday, March 15th at 11:59 pm

You may submit your application through the Miami Foundation's online application portal. To access the online portal, please visit the Miami Foundation's Scholarship page at scholarships.miamifoundation.org. Carefully review the registration instructions.

These guidelines provide important details on attachments that must be submitted online with your application. The Foundation will not accept any late applications. **No exceptions.** Documents cannot be emailed or faxed to the Foundation. If an application is missing information, our office will not inform the applicant nor review the application.

Eligibility - Applicants Must:

- Have a 2.5 GPA average or above
- Document financial need. Eligible students must have a family income that is less than 60% of the median family income of the area in which they reside. [Click here for a resource link.](#)
- Demonstrate an interest in school and community activities
- Be a high school senior graduating in Spring 2026 from a Florida High School
- Provide a complete application, including two (2) required letters of recommendations

- Employment:** Have you been involved in outside jobs that have contributed to the support or welfare of your family? If you have, please describe how.
- Honors:** List all honors, awards, or recognitions received. List the achievements related to your major interest area first.

Required attachments: The four (4) items below must be submitted for your application to be complete. Please read carefully the following to understand your options for submitting this information, which must be received by Sunday, March 15, 2026.

Upload Your Photo Online with your online application:

Upload to your online application a professional looking headshot that can be used for publications.

Upload these three (3) items. The forms below are included with these guidelines. Print or digitally share with the person required to provide the information and sign the form then upload and submit online with your application.

- Parental Information Form:** This should be completed and signed by your parent or legal guardian. You must **scan the form as a PDF** to upload online and submit with your online application.
- Transcript with Registrar's Form:** Provide the form to your School Registrar, who must complete the form and provide a copy of your transcripts. Grades downloaded from the internet will not be accepted. You must **scan the form and the transcripts into a single PDF document** to upload online as a single document and submit with your online application.
- Two (2) Letters of Recommendation:** As a part of your scholarship application, please provide a letter of recommendation written by a teacher, faculty member, or community member on your behalf. The writer should be an individual that has been involved in your high school education or from a member of the community whom you have worked with. The letter should speak to your character, the nature and quality of your academic work, intellectual depth or breadth, character, strengths, and personal qualities. The letter should also state how the recommender knows you and for how long they have been acquainted with you. You must **scan each letter into a single PDF document** to upload online and submit with your online application.
